### BECOME A DRIVING INSTRUCTOR IN 2005

David Rossiter Chief Driving Instructor

Rocky Mountain Region PCA is a successful organization because everyone pitches in. One of the best ways to help the club is as a driving instructor. Instructors are an essential element in the club's driver education program. Instructors also play a major role in ensuring the safety of our drivers.

Because of the importance of driving instructors, the club has an established process to help members become instructors. The process has three elements:

- 1. **Selection**: Instructor candidates are selected for training based on qualifications that include:
- Minimum three consecutive years of active participation in RMR/AMR driver education events, at least three events per year, or equivalent.
- Good working knowledge of rules and procedures of RMR/AMR driver education events.
- Familiarity with Colorado tracks.
- Strong driving skills and knowledge of principles of vehicle dynamics, safety, and driving technique.
- Ability and willingness to drive your car safely and well at RMR/AMR driver education events.
- Ability to communicate accurately and well with a diverse group of students. Instructors must work well with a range or personalities, motivations, abilities, and experience levels.
- Enthusiasm, patience, and good judgement. It also helps to be willing to learn from students and other instructors.
- Intention to participate actively in RMR/AMR driver education events.
- A complete statement of instructor candidate qualifications can be found on the RMR website.

- Interested members should complete and submit an instructor application by March 1, 2005. The application is available at the RMR website or from the Chief Instructor.
- 2. **Training**: If your application is approved, you will be expected to participate in a half-day instructor orientation session and to work with current instructors to develop your in-car instructional skills. This year's orientation is scheduled for April 9, 2005.

In-car training will be conducted during driver education events. You will ride with other RMR instructors and observe their instructional techniques. They will ride with you and help you develop your own instructional skills. This training will build both your instructional skills and your confidence. We will give you as much in-car training as you need.

3. **Testing**: The third element of instructor certification is testing. Testing ensures the club and its members that driving instructors have the necessary knowledge and skills to do the job correctly and safely. We use a simple and practical system of "check rides" in which you will instruct a current instructor who is playing the role of a beginning or intermediate-level student.

Check rides will be conducted during driver education events this year. This will provide flexibility to accommodate the needs of individual instructor candidates.

If you believe that you meet the club's qualifications, please consider becoming a driving instructor this year. Instructing can be quite challenging and it definitely requires effort, but you will find instructing to be very rewarding and great fun.

I can understand this concept, considering the past four years of my life have been completely devoted to the Porsche Club of America as your Zone Representative. Instead of answering just Sean, I thought it would be a good time to close this part of my life by bidding you all a fond farewell.

In doing so, I will bring closure to this wonderful time of my life too. I will describe for you just what it is a Zone Representative does. To begin, Porsche Club of America consists of one hundred and forty-two Regions, split into thirteen Zones. Each Zone has a Zone Representative. Zone 9 consists of seven Regions. Zone Representatives work long hours and spend many weekends traveling the highways and byways going to and from regional and national events.


Because the Zone Representative is in the best position to know their Regions, we may be called upon by National council members or committee chairmen to assist in various special situations. We also serve as regional Safety Observers if we are present at an event. What the description does not address is the fact that for many members I am the only PCA National representative they may have convenient access to. In most regional disputes I will act as the catalyst, the arbitrator, and at times the person in the middle between the member regions and the Executive Council.

Zone Reps are responsible for assisting the Regions in any way they can, and should help to ensure the general welfare of each of the regions in their Zone. We try to meet with each Region President a minimum of once a year, but usually more often. We solicit written regional proxies for all national Board of Directors meetings, after giving explanations of known issues prior to the National Board meetings. We have monthly conference calls with the other

twelve Zone Reps and Tom Bobbitt, PCA President. Many hours are spent at the computer answering email and writing Quarterly reports. To view these reports, just access the PCA.org website, then Admin, and proceed on to reports.

I am looking forward to retiring as your Zone 9 Representative; however, you will continue to see Walt and me at many of your regional events. It has been my great pleasure to represent Zone 9 for the past four years. I now wish to introduce to you my replacement. Howard Burr of the Alpine Mountain Region was appointed to the position November 30th and will assume the duties January 1st of 2005. Howard will do his best to continue to represent the regions of Zone 9, and will be contacting the seven Zone Presidents very soon.




